Path Forward Community Fund New Project Application

The objective of the Path Forward Community Fund is to support the self-determination of safety planning in Indigenous communities and address systemic, Indigenous-specific causes of gender-based violence through capacity-building and community planning.

The distribution of medium-size grants will be guided by an adjudication committee of diverse Indigenous People(s) that reflect the perspectives and experiences of on- and off-reserve individuals, disabled community members, Indigenous men and boys, LGBTQA2S+ folks, Elders and youth, First Nations, Inuit, Métis, and non-status communities.

Eligible uses for Path Forward funds include:

- i. Building capacity
- ii. Hosting engagement and facilitation
- iii. Support to develop crisis response plans
- iv. Materials for communication plans
- v. Information sharing and tools to navigate the justice and public safety systems
- vi. Culturally appropriate safety training
- vii. Healing and Cultural Support

Funding for the Path Forward Community Fund in 2024-25 was made available through a new Canada-British Columbia bilateral agreement as part of the National Action Plan to End Gender-Based Violence. Support for the Path Forward Community Fund furthers the ongoing work under Safe and Supported: B.C.'s Gender-Based Violence Action Plan.

Project Timeline

Applicants can apply with a projects either 18 or 24 months in length.

- i. 18 month projects are eligible for up to \$150,000.
- ii. 24 month projects are eligible for up to \$200,000.
- **iii.** Half of the approved grant amount will be dispersed after the acceptance letter has been sent.
- **iv.** A second payment will be allocated after the receival of the mid-point evaluation which is completed at the half-way mark of the project (i.e., 9 months into an 18-month project or 12 months into a 24-month project).
